<p><b>Input-Output Modelling of Employment and Scenarios</b> Estimation of labour demand in the economy or region based on interindustrial transactions. Production activities generate direct demand for labour. They also generate indirect labour demand in the rest of the economy through intermediate input demands from other sectors. The input-output (I-O) model yields solutions for total, direct and indirect labour (skills, jobs, gender etc.) requirements induced by final demand (consumption, government spending, investment, exports). <p><b>Occupational Segregation and Glass Ceiling</b> Gender equality norms in public policy and limits to their adoption in the private sector. Measurement of discrimination by gender in the firms and production sectors. Case studies and project work with horizontal and vertical occupational segregation and glass ceiling indices. <p><b>Urban Wellbeing –Municipality policies with Indicators</b> Rights based approach to local policy design, implementation and budgeting as an alternative to social work perspective. Reconciling human rights approach with capabilities to audit municipal policies and track improvements with related indicators of wellbeing during the pandemic.
